#### Course Description

Discover effective education strategies used by conservation professionals to target specific resource management issues to the correct audiences. This course helps participants incorporate evaluation strategies into program planning and implementation. Participants also learn how to work with students, teachers, youth groups and their leaders, both on public land and private lands. *You will begin developing a project for your site during the course, then implement and complete it as a required post-course assignment.*



#### Objectives

- Identify ways EE can support your site's mission.
- Identify ways to work with the formal and informal education community including schools, youth groups, homeschoolers, museums, and other related groups.
- Develop programs and materials to address resource management objectives and education community needs such as meeting state standards.
- Apply a planning and evaluation process through the development and implementation of an EE lesson/program.
- Implement an EE lesson/program on or off site.

#### Who Should Attend

Resource managers, educators, outdoor recreation planners, law enforcement officers or anyone whose job requires contact with "the public" or whose resource management efforts would be enhanced or supported by education initiatives.
